BIOL Prerequisites

The committee discussed a faculty request to change the prerequisite on BIOL2252 & BIOL2254 that were submitted in March, which was past the January deadline. The committee agreed the prerequisites would remain as approved at the 3-24-04 meeting. If the biology department faculty from both campuses believes the prerequisites should be changed for the next year, that recommendation should be presented to the next AASC committee. However, both campuses biology department faculty must agree on the prerequisites to be submitted at that time.

Questions were raised about prerequisites for distance education courses.

Chair Stipend

Kent proposed that Ruth and Kathy each be paid the full stipend instead of halving the stipend due to the dramatic changes that occurred this year. Unanimously approved by the committee.

NCA

The following questions need to be answered by July and then a site visit will occur in May 2005.

- 1. What change is being proposed?
- 2. What factors led the organization to undertake the proposed change?
- 3. What necessary approvals have been obtained to implement the proposed change?
- 4. What impact might the proposed change have on the challenges identified by the commission as part of or subsequent to the last comprehensive visit?
- 5. What are the organization's plans to implement and sustain the proposed change?
- 6. What are the organization's strategies to evaluate the proposed change?

Kent asked the committee to consider faculty volunteers to serve on committees to answer the questions. The committee discussed the need for someone who will be the comprehensive narrator/writer of the report.

Pre-meets

Establish faculty pre-meets next year via ITV to streamline the process. A trial pre-meet will be scheduled for the next meeting.

AA in EGF

Discussion occurred regarding offering the AA degree on the EGF campus next year. Concern was expresses that TRF is fearful of the loss of students, which will lead to the loss of faculty. Others believe the end result will benefit both NCTC campuses due to the fact the degree will target different audiences. The committee suggested various ways of implementing the AA degree: through distance courses – via ITV courses – commuting students via bus between campuses – adult learners on weekend college.

Kent suggested a cross functional AA advisory group from both campuses be established to layout how to strengthen the AA on both campuses and strategize the implementation at EGF. Mike will recruit members from EGF and Kathy will recruit members from TRF. A Motion made and seconded to approve the AA degree in EGF. Motion approved.

The committee will meet the second Wednesday of each month alternating the meeting times: mornings in EGF from 9-12noon and afternoons in TRF from 1-4pm. The first meeting next year will be September 8 in TRF from 1-4pm – lunch provided.
