Program Specific Requirements (Standing Agenda Item)

Aviation Maintenance Technology -- AAS

Students achieving assessment scores below the established minimums must register and successfully complete (with a grade of C or better) the required developmental courses in order to meet graduation requirements. English course requirements are listed in the curriculum summary. Arithmetic assessment scores must be greater than or equal to 50 or students must complete MATH 0080 or a higher level course.

Waiver Language for FYEC 1110 in the AA Program Plan

A student who is in good academic standing, and has 24+ college transfer credits when applying to NCTC (not including CHS or OCHS), or a student who has completed 24+ credits in a NCTC program of study other than the Associate in Arts program (not including CHS or OCHS), may request a waiver from FYEC 1110: Pathways to Success. Students who are in good academic standing and have completed a similar course at another accredited college or university may request a course substitution.

Nursing Transition Plan

The document indicated the transition plan in Nursing will be extended by one year.

Hybrid Course Guidelines

The committee reviewed a copy of the proposed hybrid course guidelines. Several faculty groups and the eLearning committee have reviewed the language. A motion was made, seconded and approved to support the hybrid course definition and guidelines.

NCTC Leave Policy

The committee reviewed a draft copy of the Leave Policy. A sub group of faculty members are working on the policy. The college will review and recommend suggestions. The committee discussed the meaning of good academic standing and establishing a couple criteria. Questions raised in possible conflicting statements in paragraph 1 and 3. The policy will be brought back in the fall for a second reading.

3000 level Series Policies

The committee reviewed and discussed the 3000 level series policies. No changes were recommended. They will be posted for review by all employees and students. The policies will also be forwarded to Cabinet for final approval.

Hybrid Course Guidelines

Hybrid Course Definition

A hybrid course at Northland is a course which combines online and synchronous classroom delivery. Typically, to be designated as a hybrid course either of the delivery methods (online/synchronous classroom) will constitute no more than 75% of the course. Proctored examinations are NOT considered part of the minimum 25% synchronous classroom times. As with any course design, the specific structure and delivery mode should promote student success and achievement of course learning outcomes.

Hybrid Course Scheduling

1. The course schedule should use the appropriate media code.
2. The course schedule should utilize the “notes” field to identify the proportion of reduced seat time. (i.e. percent synchronous classroom delivery versus online delivery - 25%, 50%, 75%)
3. The schedule should accurately reflect intended room use (need to check with Lori Johnson about what’s possible).
4. The percent of campus versus online meetings should be available on the schedule for students (in the notes field) by the first day of student registration.
5. Students taking hybrid courses should be encouraged to complete the assessment for online readiness.

Identifying New Hybrid Courses

Prior to an initial hybrid course offering, individuals should have a conversation with their supervisor regarding pedagogy and how course design supports course outcomes, as well as professional development opportunities to prepare for teaching online.
