### **SENSE and CCESSE**

Review of SENSE results over years from 2010 - 2018

A number of results went up in 2018. NCTC appears to be up compared to the cohort. Mandatory advisement seems to have assisted students in the selection of programs and courses. Lowest Aspects indicated students didn't know how to get in contact with instructors, use of computer lab, skipping classes more so than the cohort. Faculty mentioned we have cyber areas so maybe students didn't consider that as labs. Many of our programs require laptops so not using the labs. Early access of academic support services and skipping class raises some concerns. Hard to determine what students were thinking. Survey is taken in the first 6-8 weeks of semester for new students.

# Review of CCESSE results over years from 2008 – 2018

Active and Collaborative Learning, Student Effort, Academic Challenge, Student-Faculty Interactions, Support for Learners. Results were low on a number of the benchmarks. Student expectations and attitudes are a lot different than it was 10 years ago. Could look at high performing institutions on student effort and implement similar practices. Lowest aspects of student engagement were frequency of use of peer or other tutoring, two or more drafts of a paper before turning in, number of books read on your own not assigned, frequency of use of career counseling, frequency of use of computer labs. It's hard to determine what students were thinking. Mary will present the same information to all employees in February. Cohorts are 2 year colleges. Can pick institutions to compare NCTC against. Jodi was taking notes for possible actionable projects.
