"Cuz of Covid" are the three little words that affected so much this past year and it is also why we didn't have a traditional advisory board meeting last fall. We won't have one this spring as well. In lieu of a meeting we wanted to check in with everyone. Considering everything, we feel the department is doing well and we hope you are all doing well also.

Prior to last fall administration capped our first year enrollment at 14 (versus 20) to allow more distance between students. A handful of students were out at various times to quarantine or because they contracted Covid but largely it was a non-issue. Students can attend class via Zoom at any time. We also have two new students this spring taking Environmental Design and Model Building so hopefully they will return full time in the fall. Administration will likely start a search that summer but if you know of anyone who might be interested you can put it on their radar. Ideally the candidate would be an architect with construction experience and Revit knowledge.
