Steve brought feedback to the committee that he thinks the students from this program are not as well prepared as students from NCTC in Bemidji or Wahpeton. Rick has been the 2<sup>nd</sup> year teacher for 1 full year now and seeing progress.

Steve told of how NCTC in Bemidji had access to matching grant money after Bergstrom & Wiebolt donated excess materials to the program. Is this available for the school in EGF?

Anne & Steve offered to donate excess items to the program, Rick to follow up with the school to see if there are matching fund available.

Other Offers were to have the students tour projects with area contractors, Steve volunteered Dave Lawson's expertise to make CAD drawings etc. for the spec house.
