History of program on the reservation	Sue Field	Where we have been Summer 2006 and 2007: 68 Certified Nursing Assistants Summer 2008 and 2009: 57 Certified Nursing Assistants (some with mentorships) May 2008: 18 Registered Nursing Graduates May 2009: 19 Practical Nursing Graduates To graduate May of 2010: 18 RN students To graduate May of 2011: Practical Nursing students ???
2. Where we are today	Sue Field	Only 15 students in PN program started this year. Limited interest in the program. Many are not passing at this point. It seems like we have saturated the interest of students in the area. Need to step back, complete the PN cohort here (done in May of 2011), possible come back in the future if there are enough students and need in the future. Pat Butler from HH stated that she has more applications for open positions lately then

		she has ever had. Can't hire them all. Only has 1-2 LPN's at this time, most are RN's since many of her LPN's completed their RN last year. Rachael from Mahnomen Health Care Center: staff stable for 1 year. Minimum applications for openings typically. Influx of RN applications. Hospital has more apps than Nursing Home. With the economy, many nurses are staying employed. Others are applying here because of cutbacks in the Twin Cities and other areas.
3. Other Programming on the reservation	Advisory Committee	Dean Johnson: discussion whether NCTC would be interested in bringing other programs to reservation such as auto body? NCTC is interested in partnerships. Discussions of offering 2 years auto/body then 2 years of nursing? The economic development plan for the reservation includes education. Students need education to succeed in business. NCTC and WETCC would like to work together to determine further programs that could be brought to the reservation in a collaborative work arrangement.
4. Building	Wannetta	WETCC is looking into purchasing the Nursing Education Building. They will know if they have funding by February. The PN students will need a classroom for the fall 2010 and spring 2011 sessions. Wannetta shared that there will be a classroom available for students in their new building if needed.
Nursing Assistant program	Sue and Wannetta	Wannetta from WETCC discussed that they might consider the nursing assistant as a part of a core allied health program series.
6. For future	NCTC	We would need a cohort of 30 students to start another nursing group. If WETCC can get 30 students ready for PN program, NCTC would consider returning with nursing program.
