Administration Report		In October, it was announced that there would be no program cuts this year, but instead we would be offered more tools to help with the program sustainability

Previously we had been in the bottom. The Pharmacy program will be meeting the Dean to look at ideas on how to improve this data. Danika asked the advisory board for help in filing out the progress report for this. The Program Sustainability committee will help in these areas: -Consult with current and former students to see how the program can be more viable. -Marketing methods that include program brochures -In-depth look at similar programs Curriculum changes -Examination of community, area business, and industry needs and relationships, including program contributions to the community and regional businesses -Personal recruitment sessions.
Discussion: -A significant change would be to bring part of the program to an online or hybrid format. Labs designates to weekends/evening condensed. This would allow for more students to be able to participate and still maintain their current employment and have the ability for a more flexible opportunity. - Commercials, radio spots, magazine, and newspapers.
