NEW BUSINESS:					
Scrubs Academy Participation at UND Camp	Shervold	The program will participate again this June with the Scrubs Academy. Rich Lofgren and Al have worked together on this participation. Approximately six students will assist with these sessions and will be released from clinical to do so.			
Program Assessment Data - annual update	Beland	Program Mission, Goals, and Student Learner Outcomes (SLOs) were assessed by those in attendance and will be distributed to those unable to attend for approval or addendums via email. An attendance sheet was signed.  Improvement on employer participation was discussed. Beland inquired about how we can improve on communicating to assure one evaluation is completed per graduate. One facility responded with one evaluation for multiple graduates.  • Action Plan: Beland will work on the survey monkey statement/link to assure a means for completing one survey per graduate. Those in attendance also stated they will complete 1 survey per new grad hire.  Discussion on unmet benchmarks:  • RADT2240 – Reg. Prep Comprehensive Exam – Image Critique was unmet = goal is for 100 % of the students to score or greater; 2 students were under (75% and 73%)  • Action Plan: Discussion occurred with increasing the number of test questions and leaving the benchmark as is. Increasing from 51 to 75 questions for Class of 2020.  DEB KING NEEDS TO ADD CLASS OF 2019 RESULTS TO Assessment Plan as it was discussed at this meeting.			



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 Registry Prep Graduate professional portfolio 88% out of 90% goal

 Action Plan: The instructional document for portfolio completion has been revised for the class of 2019 to assure a thorough understanding of the requirements. In addition, the grading rubric has been slightly revised to assure students are aware that formatting, grammar etc. will be considered.

King addressed some of the low markings due to student lack of effort in some areas of this capstone project. Some students did not follow-through with evidence regarding the ARRT CQI process as well as self-evaluation. Those two areas on only a few graduates did bring down the average score. No plan to make changes to this tool or benchmark at this time, as student effort is reflected in the benchmark.

Members in attendance inquired about interview attire etc. King addressed how we approach this during fall semester final presentations – interview attire is required. Feedback is important from those members in attendance when they experience this.

Club membership – Beland inquired about whether or not members feel this tool measures this SLO. Al addressed maybe tracking the volunteerism related to club activities instead of club membership. Beland stated that would be difficult and time consuming and may still not achieve a measurable mark. This benchmark may be removed from the assessment, hopefully replaced with a clearer, attainable goal. Motioned to leave tabled discussion related to how professionalism can be measured with Rad Tech Club membership/activities etc.



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NCTC's Program Sustainability Review	Beland	Rad Techs program sustainability report is in the green which is good. The report does have an error and is in the process of being revised; completion for FY18 was inaccurate.
Plan for fall semester schedule regarding first year students	King	King indicated she will be scheduling first year students for P.M.'s and possibly weekends during semester one as she has received information from the JRCERT that this is acceptable as long as Clinical I has student learner outcomes that address outcomes other than just procedural, which the outcome does. It would be ideal to have no more than four first year students in the Altru hospital department during the day shift if at all possible, but in addition, it will be advantageous to allow students the opportunity to experience the shift differential and variety of patients and exams during those times.
Draft for the critical thinking rubric and implementation	King	King hopes to have a rubric draft for the clinical instructor meeting on March 26 <sup>th</sup> . The new evaluation will be implemented at the start of fall semester.
Clinical updates	King	King has been working Casie G. from Altru south pain management and has established a plan to have students rotate through pain management and gain more experience with the C-arm. This will allow students more experience with the ARRT's C-arm requirement which has been changed to reflect that students meet competency in working with the C-arm requiring multiple manipulations. The plan is to implement this fall semester for second year students and summer semester (2020) for first year students.
