Campus Impact

- **Automotive Service Technology is offered only in Thief River Falls (a plan will be put in place to finish EGF students for FY12 – no new starts)**
- **Construction Electricity is offered only in East Grand Forks (a plan will be put in place to finish TRF students for FY12 – no new starts)**
