Parking Fee Increase Proposal	Clinton Castle	HandoutSummary of 5 year maintenance program for the parking lots. Proposing \$.50 per credit increase to \$2.50/credit to max at 15 credits = \$15/year increase, \$20 annually to faculty and staff. Set max in summer at 8 credits. Total of \$95 cap at 2.50/credit @ 15 cr. fall,15 cr. spring & 8 cr. summer. Agreed by this group. Becky proposes to take out employee parking fees twice per year, rather than three times per year, which is presently done. To do the deductions 3 times per year is a huge time consuming process for HR. Shari Olson will bring to SGC Dennis B. and Mary will bring to Student Senates
