Curriculum – course offerings, course changes, class caps, etc.

- Curriculum changes from FY2010 go into effect in FY2011

 Looking into curriculum for teaching Green Associates (Rod is working toward getting certified as a Green Associate and LEED certified - he is registered for the class required before he can sign up to take the first part of the certification exam)

Advisory Committee Recruitment

- Met with advisory committee on 9/28/10 and developed a number of strategies

Program Changes – Delivery mode, add/change awards, etc.

- Engineering Tech is a potential option for a new program because we already have the software and equipment necessary; we would be competing with 2 strong existing programs – Detroit Lakes and Wahpeton
