OLD BUSINESS	ITEMS			
Finance Committee Update	Nelson	Stephen distributed a handout regarding the finance committee discussion. The proposed name is the Financial Sustainability and Innovation Committee. The committee will discuss budget and finance-related items, but also serve as a think tank for projects like Perkins, program sustainability tools, and understanding the allocation framework. Please forward Shannon or Stephen any ideas you may have. They will continue to work on shaping and defining. ACTION: They will provide a report at the next meeting.		
Newsletter Update	Bona	Dr. Bona shared that Chad Sperling has found a software for this project. It will allow employees to submit items for the newsletter in an efficient process. He is planning to have one produced by the end of the semester. The goal is to start monthly and then go to payday Friday's.		
Food Service Ideas	Amundson	Shannon shared that employees could request catering from food service. Food service will have the right to turn down any requests due to schedule, staffing, and availability. Shannon also shared that they were incorrect with originally charging sales tax for Northland catering services. These charges will be refunded on college credit cards. Personal purchases do need to pay tax.		
Radio Station Update	Bona	Dr. Bona shared that there has been a new development in the federal funding that once supported our radio station. Several radio stations objected to the new amount requirements. CPB has tentatively shared that it would give a one-year waiver to reassess what amount would be appropriate for small stations. At this time, once an official statement is made, Northland will be extending the radio station for another year.

Open Enrollment Update	Lane/ Amundson	Mary Amundson shared that Altru is in discussions to enter into a contract to be a cost level II. Kristi has not seen an official notice. Currently, Segip is sharing that they are talking with Altru to be at a level III.
Bookstore Listening Sessions	Jesme	Shannon shared that Gary from Minneapolis Community and Technical College will be on-site on Friday, November 9 th . She encouraged faculty to attend and share issues regarding the virtual bookstore model. ACTION: Julie will schedule larger rooms and send out a notice.
OER Grant Update	Huschle	Brian provided a brief update on the current OER grants. They have spent all of grant funds. He plans to continue to fund \$3000 each year to continue with course conversions. If there is additional interest, we could apply for additional grants. The Achieving the Dream grant project is wrapping up. It was determined that any unspent funds can be used on other OER initiatives.
Grade Schemes	Huschle	Brian shared that Northland will no longer be sharing a D2L portal with Distance Minnesota. Northland will have its own portal. This will allow us to turn on the grading feature. He has worked with the division chairs to establish 5 generic grade schemes that will automatically upload into Eservices. Faculty are able to choose a grade scheme or continue to enter grades manually. Faculty requested to add grade schemes to his list. He has agreed to create up to 10 of the most popular schemes to add to the list. ACTION: Brian will ask the division chairs to solicit feedback from faculty.
Summer Schedule	Huschle	The academic schedule for summer 2019 needs to be entered into the room scheduler at this time. With calendar discussions not happening until January, Brian requested a decision on the summer semester start date. ACTION: It was determined that the start of summer term will be the Monday after graduation.
